THE TRIP: TAX REBATE FOR INTERNATIONAL PRODUCTIONS

The TRIP is accessible for live-action or VFX-only projects.

VALUE

- 30% of the eligible expenditures OR 40% with VFX-related bonus
- €30M cap per project
- Up to 80% of the total budget
- No annual envelope

QUALIFYING PRODUCTIONS

To qualify for the tax rebate, a project must:

- Be a fiction film (live action* or animation), all scripted formats are eligible
- Spend a minimum of €250K on French qualifying expenditures OR 50% of your budget, whichever is the lowest
- Pass a cultural test, including dramatic content

*Live-action projects need at least 5 days of filming in France

ACCESSING FRENCH TRIP

The tax rebate is available for Production Services Companies that are subject to corporate income tax in France.

VFX BONUS

To qualify for the 10% VFX BONUS leading to a 40% tax rebate, a project must:

- Include a **substantial amount of digital visual effects**
- Include a **minimum of €2M VFX-related eligible expenses**
